Glenn Dobrogosz is CEO of the amazing new GNSC on Lawndale Drive. Mr. Dobrogosz and his staff have completely re-conceptualized the 60-year-old science museum, and re-developed it through a 3phase plan. In the first phase a brand new "Sciquarium" was built, bringing to our city its sea creatures and sci-pods for inter-active learning. This proved so popular that a building extension was opened this year. The zoo park was also extensively re-designed and stocked with new animals, and even humans were added by erecting the "Sky Wild" experience. The second phase is the complete renovation of the old Science Museum, much of which has been done, and right now the dinosaur area is under re-construction and will open soon. In today's talk, Mr. Dobrogosz will outline phase three, "Sanctuary Station."

Currently, Jennifer is being trained as a trainer by the Greensboro based Racial Equity Institute; an organization devoted to advocating for adults and children, resolving structural racism/ implicit bias issues, and addressing racial inequities.
